



**A Late 19th c. Egyptian Revival gold pendant with a Late Period faience amulet of Taweret.**

Circa: 664-332 BCE

18k gold (hallmark Cairo ram head ; arab hallmark 18k) ; Total weight: 15,43 gr

Amulet: glazed faience (restored)

This beautiful pendant is finely engraved of 7 columns of fanciful hieroglyphics inscriptions, and in the center set with an ancient amulet in faience depicting the fearless goddess Taweret.

*Egyptian goddess of childbirth who symbolized maternity and suckling. She is usually represented as a female hippopotamus with pendant mammae.*
