An iconic Bulgari Monete necklace, featuring an Roman bronze sestertius of Emperor Phillipus Caesar (AD.244-247) (Rome. M ML PHILIPPVS CAES, bare-headed, draped bust of Philip II right. Rev. PRINCIPI IVVENT, Philip II standing left, holding globe and spear.)

The coin is set in a bezel and attached to the link chain. The Monete collection is one of the most iconic Bulgari pieces at the moment. It is thanks to the timeless appearance of ancient coins. Furthermore, gold and bronze go very well together.
